Belfast, Galway, & Dublin, The Power of Information: Preservation and Suppression in Troubled Times

Course description: The course examines the relationships between information and cultural and political power in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. It will consider how information is employed to both preserve and suppress indigenous culture, including language, music and art. The critical role information (and its dissemination) plays in the politics of occupation, resistance and violence is an important theme, with a particular focus on media censorship during The Troubles. It will also consider the various roles information agencies, such as public and academic libraries and archives, have played in the preservation and suppression of Irish culture across history, with a particular focus on the impact of information services during periods of profound political unrest.

Requirements: Reader response journal, reflective blogs, multi-media research presentation
