Student Loan Support (National)

- Information about Federal Student Loan relief is available on the <u>Federal Student</u>
 Aid Coronavirus page, which is updated regularly.
 - Last updated on 2/18/21: From March 13, 2020, through the end of the COVID emergency relief period, the interest rate is 0% on the following types of federal student loans, but only if they are loans owned by ED:
 - Defaulted and nondefaulted Direct Loans
 - Defaulted and nondefaulted FFEL Program loans
 - Defaulted and nondefaulted Federal Perkins Loans
 - Defaulted HEAL loans
 - Contact your <u>loan servicer</u> online or by phone to determine if your loans are eligible. Your servicer is the entity to which you make your monthly payment. If you do not know who your servicer is or how to contact them, visit <u>StudentAid.gov/login</u> or call 1-800-433-3243 (TTY 1-800-730-8913) for assistance.

National Food Assistance Resources

- <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program</u> (SNAP; previously known as food stamps)
 - Temporary changes in eligibility requirements due to COVID (as of 1/16/21) The Consolidated Appropriations Act 2021, temporarily expands SNAP eligibility to include students enrolled at least half-time in an institution of higher education, who either:
 - Are eligible to participate in state or federally financed work study during the regular school year, as determined by the institution of higher education, or
 - Have an expected family contribution (EFC) of \$0 in the current academic year.

Unemployment Assistance

National Resources for Unemployment Assistance

- Find information about your state's unemployment benefits
- Federal law has allowed states to expand eligibility for unemployment assistance. You may now be eligible if any of the following are true:
 - Your employer permanently or temporarily laid you off due to coronavirus measures
 - Your employer reduced your work hours due to coronavirus measures
 - You are self-employed and have lost income due to coronavirus measures
 - You're quarantined and can't work due to coronavirus
 - You're unable to work due to a risk of exposure to coronavirus
 - You can't work because you're caring for a family member due to coronavirus

Massachusetts Unemployment Assistance

- The MA Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) provides unemployment benefits through Unemployment Insurance (UI), Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA), and Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC).
 - PUA provides unemployment benefits to individuals who are unable to
 work because of a COVID-19-related reason but are not eligible for regular
 or extended unemployment benefits. Check out the Pandemic
 Unemployment Assistance Benefits Guide for more information about
 PUA, including eligibility and how to apply.

Rental & Utilities Assistance

National Resources

- The National Low Income Housing Coalition (NLIHC) has a <u>nation-wide map of</u>
 state and local rental assistance programs
- Learn more about the <u>National Federal Eviction Moratorium</u> issued by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). It is in effect until March 31, 2021.
- The Housing Choice Voucher Program (also known as Section 8) helps very low-income families, elders, and people with disabilities afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing on the private market. With a Section 8 voucher, tenants pay up to 30% of their income toward rent and utilities. The remainder of housing costs are covered by the voucher.

Massachusetts Resources

- Rental Assistance for Families in Transition (RAFT) provides short-term financial assistance to low-income families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. They can help with utilities and rent.
- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Known as Fuel
 Assistance, LIHEAP provides eligible households with help in paying a portion of winter heating bills.
