

How to reset your password in MyWebSQL or in Workbench.

Type

```
SET PASSWORD = PASSWORD('mynewpass');
```

And then execute the query.

For example, in MyWebSQL you type the SET PASSWORD command in the Query (lower) panel, highlight it and click on the Query button.
