Preparing a Social Work Resume - Generalist Year Placement

In preparation for your first year of practicum MSW internship, it is important to revise your resume to reflect your new social work career path. Here are a few tips to get you started:

- Make sure your contact information (name, cell-phone number, email address) is up-to-date; agencies will use this information to contact you
 - You should use your Simmons email address; If you have not been assigned one yet, please be sure that your email address is professional
 - Make sure your voicemail is not full, and that your greeting is professional
- Make "Education" the first heading on your resume, listing that you are at Simmons University School of Social Work
 - Add that you are an "MSW Candidate," and put your anticipated graduation year
 - List your educational experiences in reverse chronological order, with Simmons listed first
 - Do not include your grade point average or your high school education
- For "Experience," consider both your previous work/employment, as well as any volunteer or unpaid experiences
 - You do not need to fit everything on one page if you have a lot of experience, but try to keep descriptions concise and clear
 - If you use bullet-formatting, start each phrase with an "action" verb in the same tense (current experiences should be in the present tense, past experiences should be in the past tense)
 - Do not use more than 3 bullet points per experience
 - If you use paragraph-style, make sure to use full sentences
- Your resume is an agency's first impression of you a tool used to assess your writing capabilities make sure to avoid typos and edit carefully
