Can I afford to study abroad?

Many study abroad opportunities are affordable. Program fees often cover full-time tuition, housing, and most meals. Federal and State aid applies to study abroad, and in some cases, you will receive an increased award to cover additional expenses. The Study Abroad Office offers scholarships for studying abroad, ranging from \$250 – \$2500.

Regional and national scholarships also exist to help aid students based on need, merit, where/what you will be studying, and other factors. With assistance from the Study Abroad office, a faculty member or the Writing Center, you can write a competitive essay.

Do credits go towards my requirements?

The programs listed here have been reviewed by the Study Abroad Office, meaning there is established confidence in the academic quality, safety, and student support services available in each program. Some programs offer volunteer or internship experiences, in addition to coursework for academic credit.
